
PINELLAS PARK (TAMPA BAY AREA) MEET STORY February 10, 2024





<u>Florida Today</u>'s Editor's note: Engagement Editor John A. Torres was discussing today's Christmas column during his weekly Thursday morning hour on the Bill Mick show. He spoke about how much his favorite Christmas movie of all time, the 1970 film "Scrooge" with Albert Finney, affected him. (John went to see the movie twice this week at the Oaks Theater in Melbourne.) Later that day John received this touching Christmas memory from Scott Easterling, who listened to the show. "Like you, I was in the theater this past Sunday afternoon here in Melbourne taking in Albert Finney in the musical Scrooge. I very much wanted to see this amazing story on

the big screen once again. In 1970 when the movie was first released, I sat with my family in a very grand movie theater in the Maryland suburbs of Washington, DC experiencing Scrooge the musical. I was in second grade that year, and arguably too young for the complex story-telling and extensions of the original story including flying thru the inhabitants of Hell and Ebenezer's eternal assignment as Lucifer's clerk in the only cold room there. No matter. My father, who at the time was just getting started in life and probably had to sacrifice a bit to get us all there, wanted us to see this side of Christmas that year.

My dad had sacrificed a couple of years earlier obtaining a massive train set for me at GC Murphy's — a regional discount department store. It was a place where he had scored a temporary position as floor help during the Christmas season of 1966, just enough to make Christmas happen for his fledgling family. I imagine his employee discount and low sales of discounted electric trains were the only reasons I could have received my "All Aboard American Flyer" train set that year.

By Christmas of 1970 we had moved out of a city apartment and into an old house my parents had purchased in the country only about 13 miles from Washington where my father had found more permanent work with the ABC Radio Network at their Washington Headquarters.

The house had a damp, cold dark root cellar type of basement with an unlit exterior entrance which was even scary at high noon in the middle of August. This root cellar's back-most room was where my electric trains were relegated when we moved into the house. This is where I spent most of my non-school waking hours in those days. It was there in that dark, dimly lit cellar that I became fascinated with engineering,

science, and electricity, eventually leading to college and an offer from Harris in a town I had never heard of in Florida — Melbourne.

The most memorable day of my 8th year on the planet (1970) was just before Christmas. Late on that cold dark afternoon I was busy playing with my trains in the cold dark recesses of the basement. I came upstairs to get an extension cord and some alcohol and cotton swabs to clean the track when daddy tells me that it is time to put away the trains because we are going to the movies. I protested, asking why and what for? He proceeded to explain the story of an old man at Christmas time with many regrets. I protested but before I knew it we were in our Plymouth Fury heading to the Langley Park movie theater. From that moment on, the images and memories are indelibly etched in my mind - the beautiful music, the modern cinematography, Ebenezer's redemption, everything. But there was one problem with all of this — I was too young for the terrifying scenes of Scrooge wrapped in chains in his eternally frozen counting chambers surrounded by rats, cold, dark, loneliness.

So, while thoroughly enjoying the experience, and looking forward to getting home to the pre-Christmas joy of my railroad empire, something had changed. That evening before dinner as I raced to the root cellar, my ears felt perpetually pinned back like a cat who hears something from behind. As I reached to open the haunted door that evening I found myself checking the backside of the door to see if Jacob Marley's pigtail might be protruding. After that, as I began the long walk down the hallway towards the back room, I half expected to see a phantom horse-drawn hearse wishing me (the Governor) a Merry Christmas. By the time I made it to my trains, the room

seemed (in my imagination) to be the frozen counting chambers of Hell and I was sure I could hear the rats and the clanking of dinner silverware being set upstairs sounding to me as if the devils were on their way with my chains. It was too much for my 8-year-old mind. I banished myself from the root cellar indefinitely.

The spell finally broke Christmas morning when my father once again surprised me with more trains; and like when Scrooge promises to find a cure for Tiny Tim, my father proclaimed to me that day that the trains could be brought upstairs and set up more permanently in my bedroom.

What a grand Christmas that was in 1970!"

Minutes - TCA Southern Division Board of Directors Meeting via Zoom November 8, 2023

A Train Collectors Association (TCA) Southern Division (SD) Board of Directors (BOD) Meeting was held November 8, 2023, beginning at 1:55 PM EST. The meeting was called to order by President Mike Setzer.

Secretary Dienzel Dennis called roll with the following board members in attendance: President Setzer; Vice President Mike Mills; Secretary Dennis; Treasurer Mike Powell; Communications Officer Bill Trappen, and Past Presidents Steve Johnson and Charlie Anyan. A quorum was present. Invited guest participating was *The Layout* Editor Mary Anyan.

Mr. Setzer advised that a one-day board meeting was held June 29 during the TCA 2024 Convention in Burlington. News was shared about TTOS folding, and this was included in the SD's fall 2023 newsletter.

Mr. Mills offered that all board members attending the Orlando/Lake Nona meet on November 11th should strongly encourage SD members to seriously consider stepping up by volunteering in an administrative capacity by serving on the board of directors. He proposed a more formal SD members' business meeting: at 9:00A the meet will open to all TCA members; at 9:25 Mr. Setzer will announce that the SD business meeting will begin at 9:30 and ask members to gather in a designated area and participate in the meeting; at 10:00A the meet will open to the public.

Mr. Dennis reported that as of this date, the SD Membership Roster contains 334 Active, 534 Inactive, and 106 Deceased members.

Mr. Powell and the board reviewed:

1. The SD 2023 3Q Treasurer's Report, previously emailed to the board.

<u>Motion</u>: The Southern Division Board of Directors approves the SD 2023 3rd Quarter Treasurer's Report as written. Motion unanimously was approved.

2. The SD FY 2024 Proposed Budget, previously emailed to the board.

<u>Motion</u>: The Southern Division Board of Directors approves the SD 2024 Proposed Budget as written. Motion unanimously was approved.

The approved reports will be included with the winter 2024 newsletter.

Mr. Trappen reported on his Communications Officer's activities since the last board meeting. He: 1) prepared and sent the mailing list files for the Summer and Fall 2023 newsletters to the printer for those members who do not receive the newsletter by email; he also sent out the email version for the Fall issue. 2) prepared the Southern Division input for the complimentary ¼-page ad and calendar of meets column for the last few issues of the TCA National HQ News and the upcoming December issue. 3) posted Orlando meet announcements on the following on-line sites: Railserve.com; OGR Forum; Toy Train Mailing List io group; Lionel Super OTrack io group; Model Train Forum; and Orlando, Lakeland and Space Coast Craigslist sites. 4) emailed the Orlando meet flyer to Guy Ateniese (Pinellas Park Meet Host) who had 500 copies printed. Guy delivered them to The Villages Train show in September. Copies were placed on the info table at that show and at the GSRR show in Deland in October. Copies were also placed at Colonial Photo & Hobby Shop in Orlando. 5) worked with Mike Mills on the Orlando meet with emphasis on the Friday BBQ luncheon/train rides event at Bruce Pemberton's including soliciting quotes for catering and table rentals and several meetings with Bruce at his property. 6) responded to several emails and phone calls with questions regarding the Orlando meet.

Minutes - TCA Southern Division Board of Directors Meeting via Zoom, November 8, 2023 (cont'd.)

Mrs. Anyan advised the board that: 1) items for the winter 2024 newsletter are due to her by December 1, 2023; 2) photos taken at all upcoming Orlando/Lake Nona events are emailed to her ASAP. She asked that SD members in photos be identified. In addition, she reminded them that prior to taking any photos of children, their parent or legal guardian must grant permission for the photos to be printed in the division's newsletters; 3) photos taken of the winners of the two water tower auctions are sent to her ASAP.

Mr. Mills, Mr. Trappen and the board discussed the 2023 Orlando/Lake Nona trifecta of events. 1) The barbeque and train rides at the Pembertons' are a "go" for Friday, November 10th. 2) The meet, dinner, water tower live auction, and show & tell are happening on the 11th. Mr. Mills stated that the train show has been highly publicized. Mr. Trappen previously had emailed the board that because the train show falls on Veterans Day, he thought it would be a nice gesture to honor any veteran attending the show by giving them a \$5 gift certificate to be used at any vendor's table. But he advised that there would be a cost to the SD and estimated that if 50 veterans used the certificate it would cost the SD \$250. The board discussed this. An alternate suggestion was to give every veteran free admission. The discussion continued and it was decided to admit veterans for free at the check-in table without requiring proof of veteran status and also make an announcement publicly thanking all veterans for their service.

<u>Motion</u>: At the November 11, 2023, train show in Lake Nona, Florida, every United States veteran who attends will receive free admission. Motion unanimously was approved.

Mrs. Anyan reported that she prepared the flyer, table registration form, and meet story for the February 10, 2024, Pinellas Park Train Show. All three documents were emailed to meet host Guy Ateniese for his review. The meet story and table registration form will be included with the winter 2024 newsletter.

Mr. Setzer advised that he spoke with TCA Convention Chairman Bob Keller regarding the 2025 convention in Jacksonville. Mr. Setzer provided info that the Bushnell museum director agreed to open the facility for a tour and miniature train rides, provided he receives a few months' advance notice. Also, SD members Clark and Ilene Vegazo offered to host a home tour of their train layouts during the convention. The plan is to include both tours on the same day, spending ½ day at each location. If anyone else from the SD is interested in hosting a home tour, they should contact Mike Setzer who will get the information to Bob Keller.

Updates: 1) Mr. Setzer advised that due to logistical issues, he advised Will Wagner that the division is unable to take over the Derrick Dean Wagner Foundation December show in the West Palm Beach area. 2) Mr. Dennis and the board revisited the possibility of a train show at the Museum of Arts and Sciences (MOAS) in Daytona Beach, and he advised the board that no further discussion is needed in the near future as logistics seem to be an issue.

Mr. Setzer and the board discussed another parking lot train show at the Bushnell Museum. A tentative date of Saturday, March 9, 2024, was proposed. Mr. Setzer offered to host. (Update: The Ocala Lions Club Model Railroaders is hosting a train show on March 9; therefore, an alternate date will be researched for the Bushnell meet. Information will be provided on the SD website and in a future newsletter.)

Mr. Setzer and Mr. Mills are in their second terms as division president and vice president, respectively. Mr. Dennis and Mr. Powell are in their 15th years as division secretary and treasurer, respectively. Mr. Dennis stated that a serious discussion and recruiting effort need to be held regarding getting SD members to perhaps assume these positions.

The Board entered Executive Session at 3:20PM EST and exited at 3:30PM EST.

During a future board meeting the board will discuss and vote on adding alternative payments for SD dues as well as table registrations for shows due to the rise in check fraud. The board solicits member comments.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:33 PM EST.
