Southern Division of TCA Board of Directors Meeting, Friday, January 24, 2014

The meeting in the MinnReg Building was called to order at 4:12 p. m. Secretary Dennis called the roll with the following in attendance. President Brad Woodward, Past President Anyan, Vice President Johnson, Secretary Dennis, and Communication Director Harris. Treasurer Powell was not in attendance due to family matters. Past President Travitsky arrived before the meeting was concluded.

A motion by Johnson, with a second by Dennis, was passed stating that we would keep the 2014 budget the same as last years until we can meet again with our treasurer in attendance. The quarter report and the Venice meet report were accepted as previously presented by our treasurer by means of an email.

There was no report from the 50th Anniversary Committee since neither of them was present at the meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that; "Southern Division dues would be waived for officers who are listed in the The Layout. Any meet host will have their dues waived for the year following their meet." This will begin in January, 2014.

The president will select a nominating committee for next year's slate of officers.

A discussion was had concerning the front table workers at our meets. Action was deferred and tabled.

We discussed ways to increase the value of our Kids Club program. We next discussed our door prize program and ways to enhance it without over spending. We decided to continue on as in the past.

Charles Anyan and Arnie Travitsky will get together and decide how to get the train signs to our next meet site. Mr. Anyan reported on the silent auction items and the process to use during our meet Saturday. He also elaborated on the problem of selling out all the tables (109) and then dealers having to back out for various reasons at the last minute. He was down more than 10 table holders from previous bookings.

The fraud on our bank account was corrected with no damage financially to our club. The bank worked well with us on this, covered all our problems, and we now have a new account.

The President's report consisted mostly of registration cards from previous meets and means of contacts for future meets. Printed list and suggestions were distributed. Vice President Johnson stated that he had nothing in particular to report. Secretary Dennis stated that all officers received a printed report from him by email earlier in the week. This reported that we have 428 active paid up members, 1 honorary member, 34 known deceased members, and 264 inactive past members who have not paid their dues for 2014. Therefore, we have 727 entrees in our data base. He also added that at the end of 2013, we had 502 active members. This is a much larger than usual decrease to begin a new year and part of it was due to the increase in national dues starting this year. As always, please inform Secretary Dennis of any changes in your address, telephone, email, etc. We want to stay in touch with our members but can only do so if our member information is correct and up to date.

Linda Harris, Communication Chair, could not find an acceptable bill board at a price we were willing to pay for this meet. However, she did get a lot of free advertising in various media in the area. She is currently working on ads for all our future meets.

The train show reports show that the Largo meet for tomorrow is in good shape and ready to go. Al Galli is progressing at a steady pace for our Palm Beach Gardens Show on March 23, 2014. Steve Johnson has set the date for the Jacksonville show and it will be Nov. 22, 2014. This is the week-end before Thanksgiving. We are currently working on more meets including one in the Central Florida area to take the place of the Maitland event.

The open house tonight will be at the Linda Harris home where we will see the collection of her late husband and long time SD member and Tinplate Tycoon, Steve Harris. Visitation hours are from 7:00 to 9:00 p. m.

There being no more business, we adjourned at 5:25 p.m.

Sad Tidings—Robert Klenner Jr. by Robert Klenner III




Those of you that knew my father may recognize some of what follows. To say that Dad and I had different perspectives on life is putting it mildly. While I lived at home, we agreed on very little and while the disagreements were loudly ar-

gued, what we did agree on was not often discussed. However, each year on the day after Thanksgiving, while most of the neighbors were starting to decorate their homes, it was time for us to get out the plywood and the carriage bolts and start assembling what was known in our home as the Christmas Garden.



Each year the Christmas Garden was different, not just in what was in it, but also in size and configuration. In 1960 it was 8 by 8 feet with a single tunnel, three O gauge trains and the only operating accessory was a Lionel Bascule bridge. I



was 7 years old and I thought it was great. At the time I had no idea where this was going to lead.

Each year that followed, the Christmas Garden became larger and more complex. Sometimes it was rectangular, sometimes a horseshoe shape with a suspension bridge made of 1 x 6, clothesline rope and crab twine, but there were always mountains with tunnels.

When I was 10, Dad showed me how to wire up the houses using cut up strings of Christmas tree lights. The next year he showed me how to solder the wires to the rails (who needs lock-ons). We cut up wooden match sticks to

make insulated track pins and took clippings from the arborvitae tree in the backyard to make the trees.

When I was 12, Dad showed me how to make the roads using a roll of roofing tar paper, a 1 by 6 for a straight edge and a linoleum cutter. To this day I still wonder why neither of us wound up at the emergency room. As the years went on more of my ideas and efforts were included, but Dad always had the magic technique for plastering the mountains and he was an artist with a can of spray paint. Most years Santa brought at least one new (to us) train. They weren't wrapped and under the tree. They would have magically appeared on the rails when you went out to the garage on Christmas morning.

Dad would spend his spare time during the year hunting the garage sales and goodwill stores to make the magic happen.

In mid-1969 came Dad's greatest "find". One Friday night, right after dinner, Dad left the house with my Mom's station wagon. When he came home several hours later the entire car, including the front seat, was filled with boxes. He hurriedly unloaded the boxes into the garage and left again. When he returned, well after 10 PM, there were still more boxes in the car and green painted sheets of plywood tied to the roof. We spent the rest of that weekend going

We spent the rest of that weekend going through those boxes. I'm sure Dad would have liked to have Santa bring these trains, but there was no way he could have hidden all of this. Those boxes and plywood were the remnants of what had been an operating layout of Lionel O-gauge. It had belonged to a Children's Home and had become too much for them to maintain and so they had decided to sell. This was the foundation for Dad's postwar collection.

As Dad had clearly been bitten by the bug, he joined TCA in January of 1970. The last Christmas Garden at Dad's where I participated in the construction was during Christmas of 1970 and it was a 16 by 16 foot L-shaped layout with six trains, a fully operating switchyard where you could change the loco-

motives or the makeup of the trains, and it had at least a dozen operating accessories.
