

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Fort Pierce meet was held on February 2 at the Fenn Center; and while I was unable to attend, by all reports it was a great success! Meet Host Al Galli continues to host a better show each year with over 300 attending this year. He's already reserved the Fenn Center for next year's meet on January 25.

As noted in earlier columns, the Largo meet has moved from its traditional January date to April this year. The meet will continue at the MinnReg Hall and will be held April 27 (see Meet Story on page 4 of this newsletter.) Charlie Anyan diligently is working to make the meet a great success, but he could use your help. By all means, please plan to attend; but also, if you are anywhere near that area please let Charlie know if you are willing and able to help in any way.

Mike Mills already is well underway planning this year's meet on September 21 at Lake Nona Middle School in the Orlando area. He has a wonderful and devoted group of helpers, and I have no doubt that it will be at least as successful as last year's smashing success!

In addition to the meet hosts mentioned above (as well as Henry Snyder and Chuck Bryner working on November's meet in Jacksonville), we have a great and dedicated group of volunteers. Many thanks to Bill Trappen who has stepped up as our Communications Director. Bill's busy in that role but also has devoted hours to his other role as convention car chair for the 2020 National Convention. His long history of participation in the SD (including past president) is to be lauded. Also, many thanks to Jake Jacob for his years of devoted service as the SD Webmaster, and welcome to Bill Porter who recently took over as Webmaster! Our VP Jay Zschau continues to fill in roles in many different aspects at both the Division as well as National levels of TCA, from membership recruitment, By-Laws review/update, and strategic planning initiatives. He even drove over from Gainesville (visiting family) to attend our Convention Planning Committee meeting in Jacksonville on March 2.



As noted above, we held a committee meeting on March 2 for planning the 2020 TCA National Convention at the Hyatt Jacksonville Riverfront. Following a tour of the hotel's meeting facilities, the committee worked on plans for registration, tours, the Marketplace (trading hall), convention cars and souvenirs, as well as a host of other topics. As previously reported, this will be a joint convention with the Department 56 Collectors Clubs which requires us to rethink some of our traditional TCA Convention guidelines. TCA National Convention Committee Chair Bob Keller drove all the way down from Atlanta. Other members came from all over Florida for a lengthy but productive meeting. With only about 15 months remaining until the convention, the amount of work to be done seems a little daunting, but I have no doubt that this dedicated group of volunteers will pull off a Convention to make all members of the Southern Division proud! Convention car designs are being finalized and include a special D56 item which should all be announced this fall.

Lastly, my perennial appeal for help – we're always looking for volunteers to help out our Southern Division in many different capacities, particularly for meet hosts and for the 2020 convention, where we'll need an army of volunteers to help with everything from load in and out (trading floor) to security to tour escorts. If you are interested in helping, please let me know as I am beginning to compile a list.

As always, I'm always open to input with fresh ideas or even constructive criticism; so feel free to email, call, or stop and chat with me at one of our upcoming meets.

The Largo Meet again will be held at the Minnreg Building, 6340 126th Ave. N., Largo, FL 33773.

<u>Set Up</u> for table holders will be Friday 1-5 p.m. and Saturday 7-9 a.m. During set up, the building only will be open to table holders and <u>authorized</u> helpers. Remember to list full name(s) of any helpers on the Registration Form.

All helpers must be a family member <u>or</u> a current member of the TCA in good standing. On Friday the 26th, we must vacate the building not later than 5 p.m.

<u>Tables</u>: 8 feet, \$20 for TCA SD members and \$30 for non-TCA SD members. Please send your completed Table Registration Form and payment <u>in advance of the meet</u> as it is hectic during Friday set up and the morning of the meet to handle administrative duties.

Food: Food trucks will be on site as food is no longer offered for sale by the Minnreg administrative staff.

All rooms are studio efficiencies and include kitchen with a two-burner stovetop, microwave, dorm-sized refrigerator, pans and dinnerware. Regular rates: \$84.74 single, \$96.04 double (taxes included). Check at registration for TCA discount. Other, reasonably priced lodging in the area is available.

Directions to above hotel:

- From Hwy. 19 Northbound: turn left on Ulmerton Rd. (Hwy. 688), go to 66th St. N., make a U-turn & go back one block to hotel.
- <u>From Hwy. 19 Southbound</u>: take 66th St. N. exit (State Route 693), go to 2nd stoplight & turn left onto Ulmerton Rd. Hotel is one block on the right.
- <u>From I-275 Northbound</u>: take the Roosevelt Blvd. exit (Hwy. 685) <u>don't miss this turn or you'll end up in Tampa!</u> Keep left and go west/north to where Roosevelt merges into Ulmerton Rd. Follow directions as above.
- From I-275 Southbound: take the Ulmerton Rd. exit (Hwy. 688), drive west to 66th St. and follow directions as above.

TCA Southern Division Board of Directors Meeting Minutes February 1, 2019 The Fenn Center, Fort Pierce, FL

The meeting was called to order at 3:04 p.m. by Vice President Jay Zschau.

Secretary Dienzel Dennis called roll with the following in attendance: Mr. Zschau; Mr. Dennis; Treasurer Mike Powell; and Past Presidents Brad Woodard and Charles Anyan. Communications Officer Bill Trappen participated by phone. Also present were Bill Porter, the SD's new Web Master, Fort Pierce Meet Host Al Galli, and Orlando Area Meet Host Mike Mills.

The minutes of the Jacksonville 2018 BOD meeting were approved and printed in the Winter issue of *The Layout*.

Mr. Zschau submitted his report on SD and TCA membership and also discussed the revision of our club By-laws and this ongoing process. He requested input from the board. With prior approval from President Steve Johnson, Mr. Zschau appointed Bill Porter as the SD's new Web Master, replacing Jake Jacobs. All in attendance agreed that Mr. Jacobs has done a tremendous job over the years and that Mr. Porter possesses the skills to assume this position. (His contact info is found on page 2 of this newsletter.)

Mr. Dennis gave the Secretary's report, previously emailed, which stated that the SD currently has 892 member listings in our database: 1 honorary member; 393 active, paid members; 428 inactive members from the last 10 years; and 70 deceased members over the last 10 years. This is the first time in a few years that the SD has been this close to 400 members just after the New Year's signups. Mr. Zschau, who spearheaded and tirelessly worked on the recruitment campaign, deserves great credit for his efforts. Many thanks also go to everyone who assisted. The report was approved.

Mr. Powell gave the Treasurer's report which consisted of the financials of the Jacksonville meet, the 4th Quarter 2018 report, and the 2019 Budget. After a brief discussion, this report was approved and will be included in the Spring newsletter.

Mr. Trappen presented his Communications Officer's report. He informed the board of all of the advertising expenses and means for SD meets. He briefly mentioned the TCA 2020 National Convention in Jackson-ville and the work taking place on this project. His report was approved.

Mr. Galli gave an update of tomorrow's meet and stated that over 100 tables will be filled with trains for our members and the public. We will not have a joint meet with the NMRA as previously explored.

Mr. Anyan reported on National information as well as his meet in Largo on April 27. The site rental will increase next year, and he will research other venues. This year's meet is satisfactorily progressing; however, food availability is an issue, and he is checking on food trucks to fill this gap.

Mr. Woodward reported on the SD's Kids Club as well as the National Kids Club. Kids Clubs are divided into 2 groups – teenagers, and those 12 and under. He also is hosting an Open House at his home tonight from 6:00-9:00 p.m.

SD members are being sought to work at the spring York show and also the National Convention in Albuquerque this summer. Tables advertising our Jacksonville 2020 National Convention will be set up, and members are needed to assist.

Another area that you'll be hearing more about as we approach it is our National Convention in Jacksonville in June of 2020. Plans for the convention are being firmed up, and there are many areas of service available to our members to contribute to this very special event. Our convention in Jacksonville is shaping up to be one of the best. Plans are being made for some great tours. As always, the TCA National Board of Directors has its annual meeting, so there is an opportunity to see how the National TCA functions and what it hopes to accomplish in the coming fiscal year. The annual membership meeting also takes place during the convention. This is an opportunity to share your views about TCA. And, of course, the annual banquet is always a highlight.

There is, as our National President has pointed out in the National Headquarters News, an easy way to get involved and to help your organization. And that is to recruit one new member to join TCA. If you do that, you will make an impact on our future. As President Campbell has stated, "...find a younger person who might be interested in model trains; become a mentor, introduce them to the toy train hobby, offer to take them to a meet, and help them start their own collection or operating layout. Tell them about other train meets, the educational aspects both in trains and how to build a layout, the friendships, the free TCA publications they will receive, our online services, the National Toy Train Library and the National Toy Train Museum."

You are a member of the world's greatest organization of people of the world's greatest hobby. Let's keep it strong, and let's help it grow so that others can enjoy it in years to come.

Webmaster Updates


















Fort Pierce BOD Meeting Minutes (cont'd.)

New Business: The SD Awards program was discussed and what is needed or expected. The board went into a brief Executive Session and then returned to the regular business meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:01 p.m.
